There will be no geographic restriction on Macao travel agencies forming joint venture travel agencies in the Mainland where the Mainland agencies have majority shareholding.</p> <p>2. To allow residents of Beijing, Shanghai, and Guangzhou, Shenzhen, Zhuhai, Dongguan, Zhongshan, Jiangmen, Foshan and Huizhou of the Guangdong Province to visit Macao individually for tourism, and to allow the same in respect of the whole of Guangdong Province not later than 1 July 2004.</p>

Specific commitments	To lower the entry requirement in the Mainland for Macao travel agencies: the annual business turnover of the Macao travel enterprises should not be less than US\$25 million for setting up wholly owned travel agencies in the Mainland; and not less than US\$12 million for setting up joint venture travel agencies in the Mainland.

<p>Specific commitments</p>	<p>1. The annual business turnover should not be less than US\$8 million for Macao travel agencies setting up joint venture travel agencies in the Mainland.</p> <p>2. The annual business turnover should not be less than US\$15 million for Macao travel agencies setting up wholly-owned travel agencies in the Mainland.</p> <p>3. To allow Macao travel agencies established on a wholly-owned or joint venture basis in the Guangxi, Hunan, Hainan, Fujian, Jiangxi, Yunnan, Guizhou, Sichuan Provinces or Autonomous Region, to apply, on a pilot basis, to provide group tours to Macao and Hong Kong for residents registered with permanent residence in these provinces or autonomous region.</p>

To delegate to the Guangdong Province the authority of approving Macao service suppliers who set up travel agencies on a wholly-owned, equity joint venture or contractual joint venture basis in Guangdong.</p> <p>2. To allow Macao permanent residents with Chinese citizenship to sit for the Mainland qualification examination for tourist guides. Tourist guide qualification certificates will be awarded to those who have passed the examination in accordance with the relevant regulations.</p>

Specific commitments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To allow Macao permanent residents with Chinese citizenship to obtain tour group escort licenses for outbound group tours and to be employed in the Mainland by international travel agencies that have been authorized to operate outbound tour groups and by Macao and Hong Kong travel agencies that are allowed to operate outbound group tours to Hong Kong and Macao. 2. Mainland travel agencies organizing outbound group tours to Taiwan can arrange for the Mainland tourists who are holding “Permit for Mainland residents traveling to and from Taiwan” and tourist visas (L visas) to stay in Macao for transit purpose so as to facilitate the Mainland and Macao tourism businesses to develop “one route, multi- stops” tourism products.
